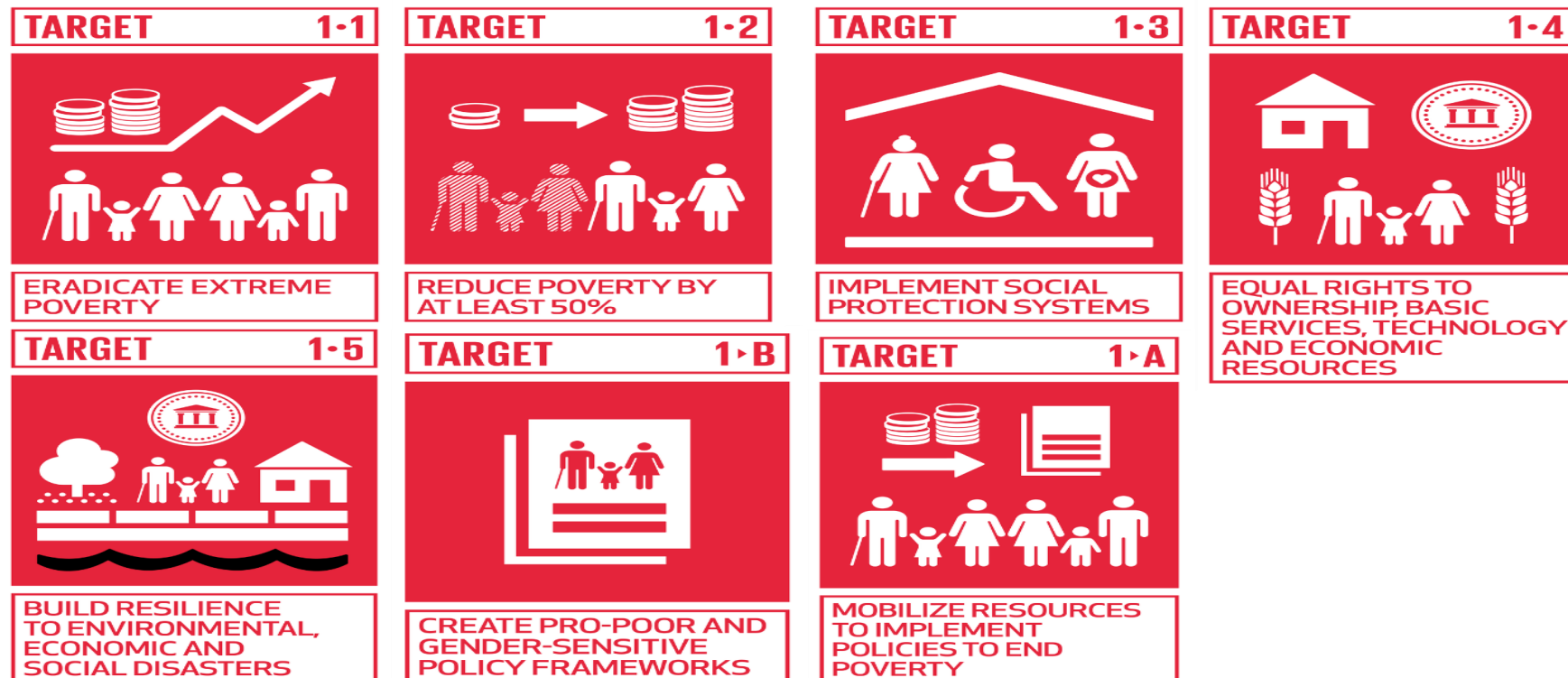

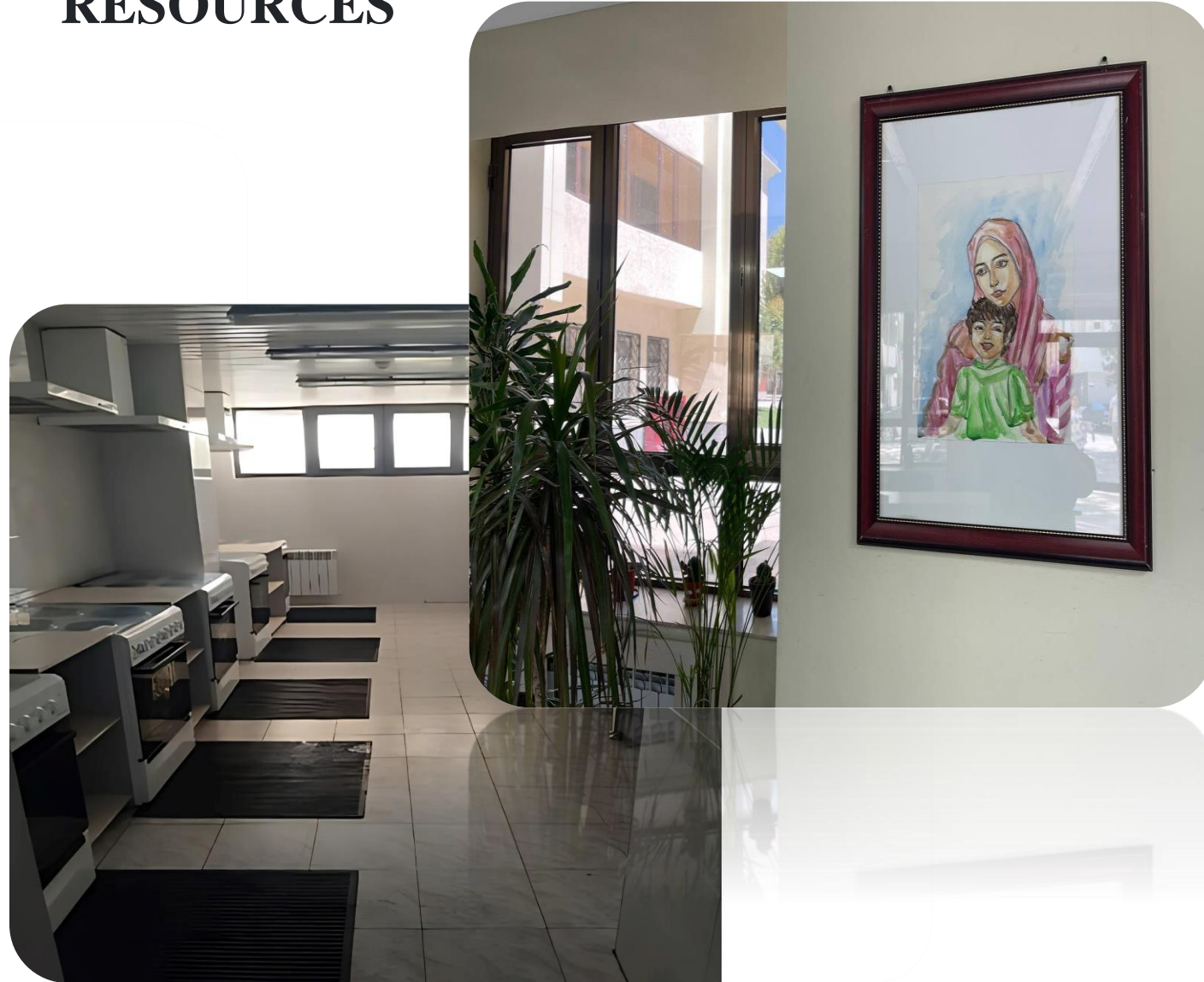

Creation of conditions for students with disabilities to move without any obstacles in social facilities on the territory of the university. Taking measures to adapt educational buildings, student accommodation, facilities and corridors for their free movement;

Making proposals for organizing internships in enterprises and organizations in accordance with the established procedure for students with disabilities graduating from the university;

Increasing the activity of students with disabilities in various events, competitions, competitions, in particular, science Olympiads;

Establishing regular free medical examinations for students with disabilities, making them healthy, and providing them with necessary medicines, medical supplies for care, and appropriate food products ride assistance;

## **EMPOWERING EVERY STUDENT: INCLUSIVE SUPPORT PROGRAMS FOR STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES IN PURSUIT OF SDG 1**

Educational and administrative buildings, student dormitory have been re-equipped with special ramps and elevators for persons with disabilities. At the same time, for the purpose of promoting inclusive education, special needs and directions for blind and visually impaired students studying at the university are identified, and the literature recommended for publication by the Academic Council of the University is published in specialized publishing houses in accordance with the needs. Measures are being taken to create audio formats of published reading materials and place them on the information resource center and distance learning platforms. In addition, the university psychologist systematically conducts seminar-training (if necessary, individual meetings) to students and tutors with disabilities in order to strengthen their integration into society.

Students with disabilities (1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> group, with visual impairment, blind students and students who have disabilities with locomotor organs as well as other types) studying at the university in 2023:

A total of 26 disabled students study at the University of World Economy and Diplomacy,

including 7 1<sup>st</sup> year students (2 girls and 5 boys);

10 2<sup>nd</sup> year students (3 girls and 7 boys);

6 3<sup>rd</sup> year students (1 girl and 5 boys);

3 final year students (1 girl and 2 boys);

and 21 of them receive additional scholarships, 3 of them have a free privilege for their studies and have the right to use students dormitory on the basis of privilege.

All conditions have been created for disabled students to study in the A and B educational buildings of the university, special rooms have been allocated for the possibility of using the elevator and for sanitary and hygienic conditions.

In connection with the 2024 "Year of Youth and Business Support", orphan students in need of social protection, who for various reasons stayed for the summer semester (re-take) in the 2023-2024 academic year, re-took according to their application. 4 students received a discount (75%) for re-studying in the summer semester of the 2023-2024 academic year (Act N 424-T).

Currently, active participation of students with disabilities in scientific conferences (4 times) and tele-courses (3 times) has been ensured. Also, 6 articles of 4 students with disabilities were published in different scientific journals.

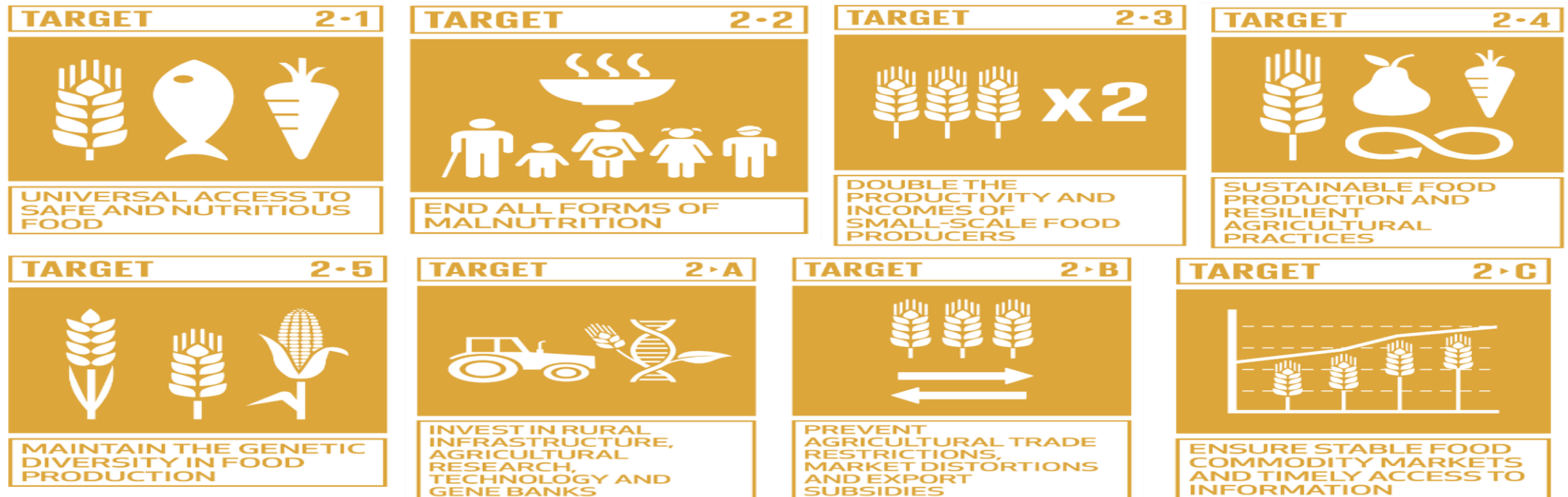

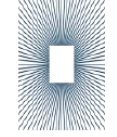






# GLOBAL CONFERENCES AND HEALTH INITIATIVES FOR ZERO HUNGER

The dissertation on *"Mechanisms of Improving the Production and Export of Fruit and Vegetables in Uzbekistan Corresponding to the World Market Requirements"* connected to Sustainable Development Goal 2 (SDG 2), which aims to end hunger, achieve food security, improve nutrition, and promote sustainable agriculture is defended by the senior teacher of the "International economics" department on 31 May, 2023. By exploring strategies to enhance the production and export of fruit and vegetables, the research addresses key aspects of agricultural productivity and sustainability. This focus on aligning Uzbekistan's agricultural practices with world market standards can help ensure that local farmers adopt efficient, sustainable methods that yield higher-quality produce. As a result, these improvements could reduce food insecurity by increasing the availability of nutritious food both domestically and internationally. Additionally, strengthening export capabilities supports the economic stability of rural communities, which can, in turn, contribute to more resilient food systems and help lift people out of poverty, furthering the goal of ending hunger and promoting sustainable food production.

On September 14, 2023, Moiliyev Elyor Bakhtiyorovich, on the topic "*IMPACT OF UZBEKISTAN'S MEMBERSHIP IN THE WTO ON THE AGRICULTURAL SECTOR*" 08.00.09 - took place the department discussion of the dissertation work prepared for receiving the PhD degree in the specialty "World Economy".



The dissertation topic, "*Impact of Uzbekistan's Membership in the WTO on the Agricultural Sector*" has significant relevance to Sustainable Development Goal 2 (SDG 2), which focuses on ending hunger, achieving food security, improving nutrition, and promoting sustainable agriculture. By examining Uzbekistan's potential WTO membership effects on agriculture, this research provides insights into how international trade policies could shape food security and agricultural sustainability in the country. WTO membership could open Uzbek agricultural markets to global competition, encouraging local farmers to adopt more efficient, sustainable, and competitive farming practices. This integration into the global economy has the potential to enhance the productivity of the agricultural sector, improve the quality and variety of available food, and increase farmers' incomes by expanding export opportunities. Furthermore, access to international agricultural standards and technologies could promote sustainable farming practices, helping to ensure that Uzbekistan's agricultural development aligns with both environmental sustainability and food security goals. Ultimately, this dissertation addresses how WTO membership can support the modernization of Uzbekistan's agricultural sector, contributing directly to the targets of SDG 2 by fostering a resilient, productive, and sustainable food system.

Government bodies such as the Ministry of Agriculture and the Ministry of Investment and Foreign Trade can introduce policies aligned with WTO standards, such as providing subsidies for smallholder farmers, promoting access to international markets, and ensuring compliance with quality and safety standards. These actions help increase productivity, reduce food insecurity, and make nutritious food more accessible and affordable for the population. By implementing these supportive actions, both government and NGO initiatives help Uzbekistan's agricultural sector grow in a sustainable way that aligns with WTO standards, contributing to SDG 2's targets of resilient food production, improved livelihoods for farmers, and a secure food supply for future generations.

A key focus is on eliminating discrimination in education, supporting equal opportunities, and creating safe and inclusive learning environments.

It is well known that training skilled specialists who contribute to the country's socio-economic development is directly related to the advancement of the education system. These tasks are reflected in several decrees and resolutions issued by the President of our Republic. There is a need for modern knowledge and innovative approaches in the socio-economic development of the country. Therefore, improving the quality of education by organizing the learning process in accordance with contemporary demands, refining state educational standards and curricula, creating new generation educational materials, using modern innovative pedagogical and information technologies, and addressing existing issues are guarantees of our future achievements.





# DEVELOPING AN INCLUSIVE EDUCATION SYSTEM: INTEGRATING EDUCATION, HEALTHCARE, AND COMMUNITY SUPPORT FOR EQUAL OPPORTUNITIES

In our country, the legal and regulatory framework for organizing inclusive education has been developed based on the strong integration of science, education, and production, aligned with the social needs and personal interests of learners. Key tasks include “strengthening the material and technical base of educational institutions, adapting curricula, increasing opportunities for high-quality health-promoting educational services, and preparing highly qualified personnel to facilitate inclusive education for children with special needs.” Improving the quality of primary education, creating an effective learning environment that aligns with state educational standards and suits students’ abilities, and strengthening cooperation between organizations and public institutions are also of critical importance. Addressing these socio-pedagogical challenges requires beneficial cooperation among education, healthcare, and community organizations to ensure quality educational services for children with limited opportunities. The UWED team consistently integrates with inclusive educational institutions to support this goal.







## UWED'S COMMITMENT TO INCLUSIVE AND EQUITABLE EDUCATION IN ALIGNMENT WITH SDG 4

The University actively contributes to SDG 4, which advocates for inclusive, equitable, and quality education for all people without exception. In accordance with Article 3 of the UWED Charter, the University adheres to the principles outlined in the [Constitution of Uzbekistan](#), the [Law on Education](#), and other relevant legislation. The Constitution, particularly Articles 50, 57, and 58, alongside Article 5 of the Law on Education, ensures equal access to education for everyone, irrespective of ethnicity, religion, disability, immigration status, or gender. A decree issued by the rector on 5 July 2023 sets out admission criteria for visually impaired applicants, allowing them to take written and test exams in Braille, and appoints a representative from the visually impaired community to the admissions committee. Furthermore, a special consultation schedule for entrance subjects has been established.





# ENSURING ACCESSIBILITY IN ECONOMIC EDUCATION FOR ALL STUDENTS

Currently, the use of pedagogical innovations in the educational process is a global trend in world development. Given the rapid pace of modernization within the country, there is a growing need to systematically introduce innovations into the education sector. At UWED, the level of pedagogical research related to the introduction of new content, forms, methods, and tools in teaching is sufficient, driven by the study and integration of international educational methods into the academic process.

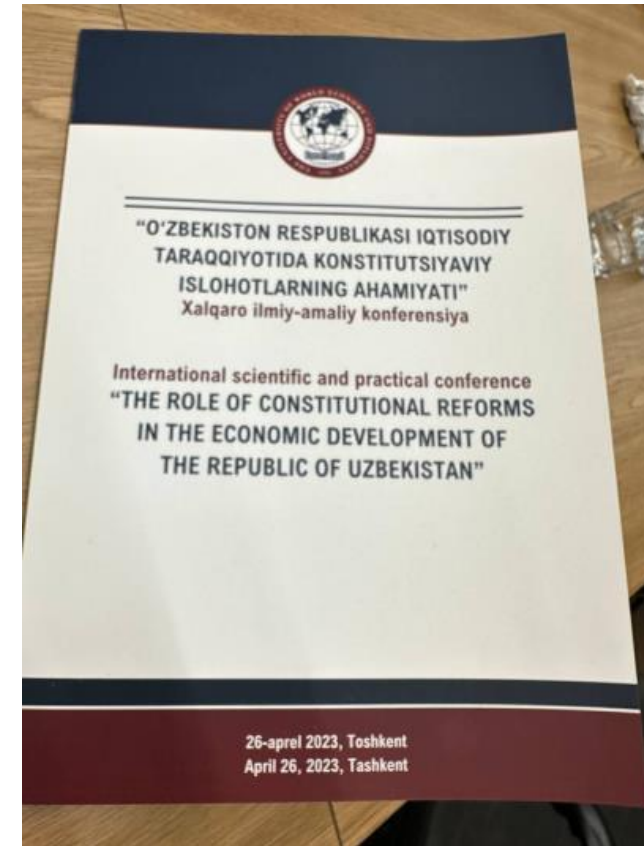

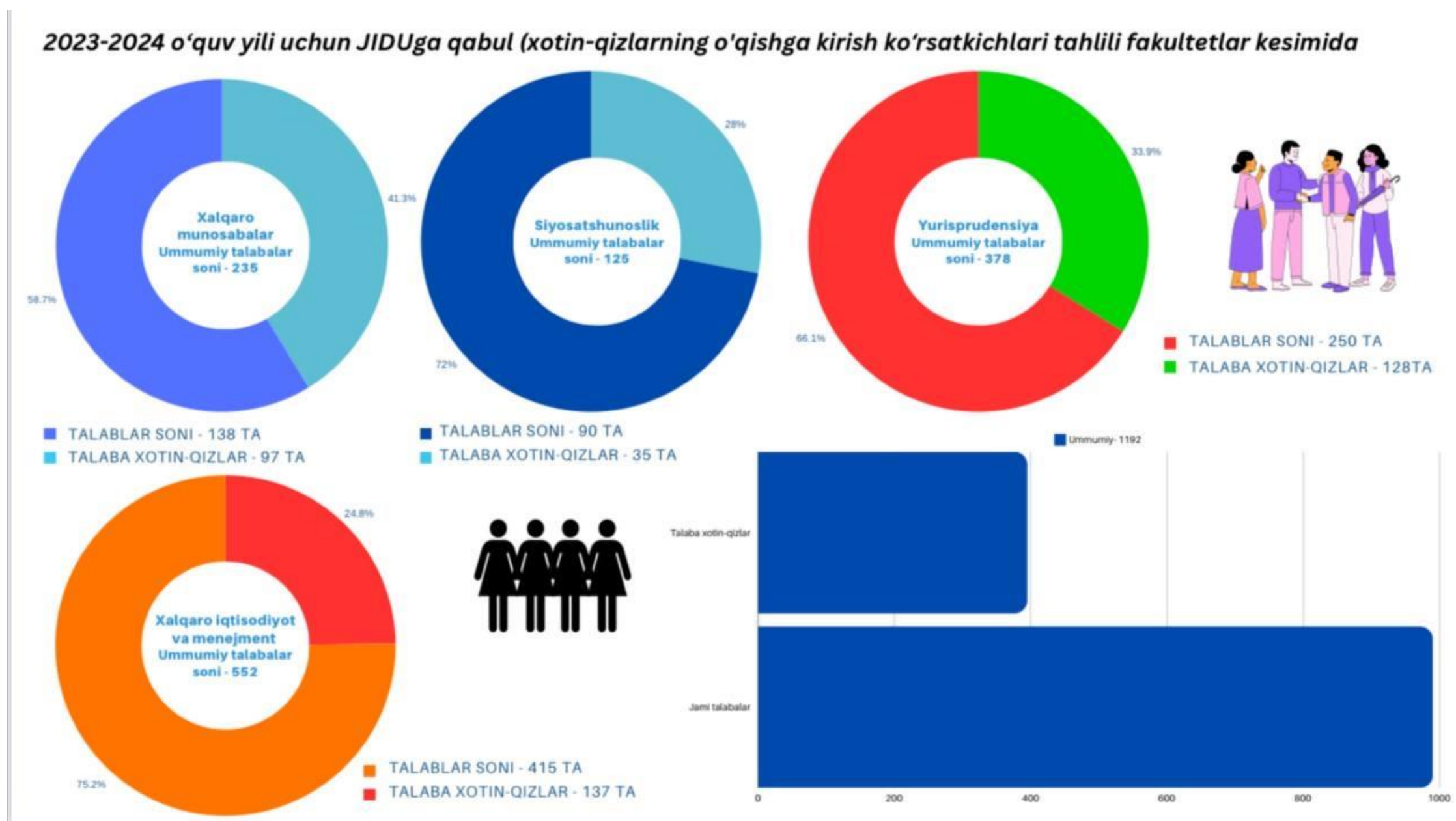
**Aims on creating an academic environment where all genders have equal access to opportunities and resources. This includes promoting gender parity in enrollment and graduation rates across all fields of study. The targets emphasize fostering a campus culture that values diversity and inclusivity, ensuring that policies and practices support equal participation in academic and extracurricular activities. It also aims to eliminate gender-based discrimination and harassment, providing a safe and supportive environment for all students and staff. Furthermore, the targets encourage the integration of gender perspectives into curricula and research, promoting awareness and understanding of gender issues.**







The university offers a broad spectrum of courses in various languages, tailored to meet the needs of both undergraduate and graduate students. In the field of International Relations, there are 95 female students enrolled. The Political Science program consists of 25 female students. In the discipline of Applied Jurisprudence, categorized by type of activity, there are 128 female students. Furthermore, the International Economics and Management program stands out as the largest, with an enrollment of 137 female students. In total, the university boasts an enrollment of 990 students, highlighting a remarkable demographic diversity within the institution, with female students constituting 39.9% of the overall student body engaged in a range of academic programs.

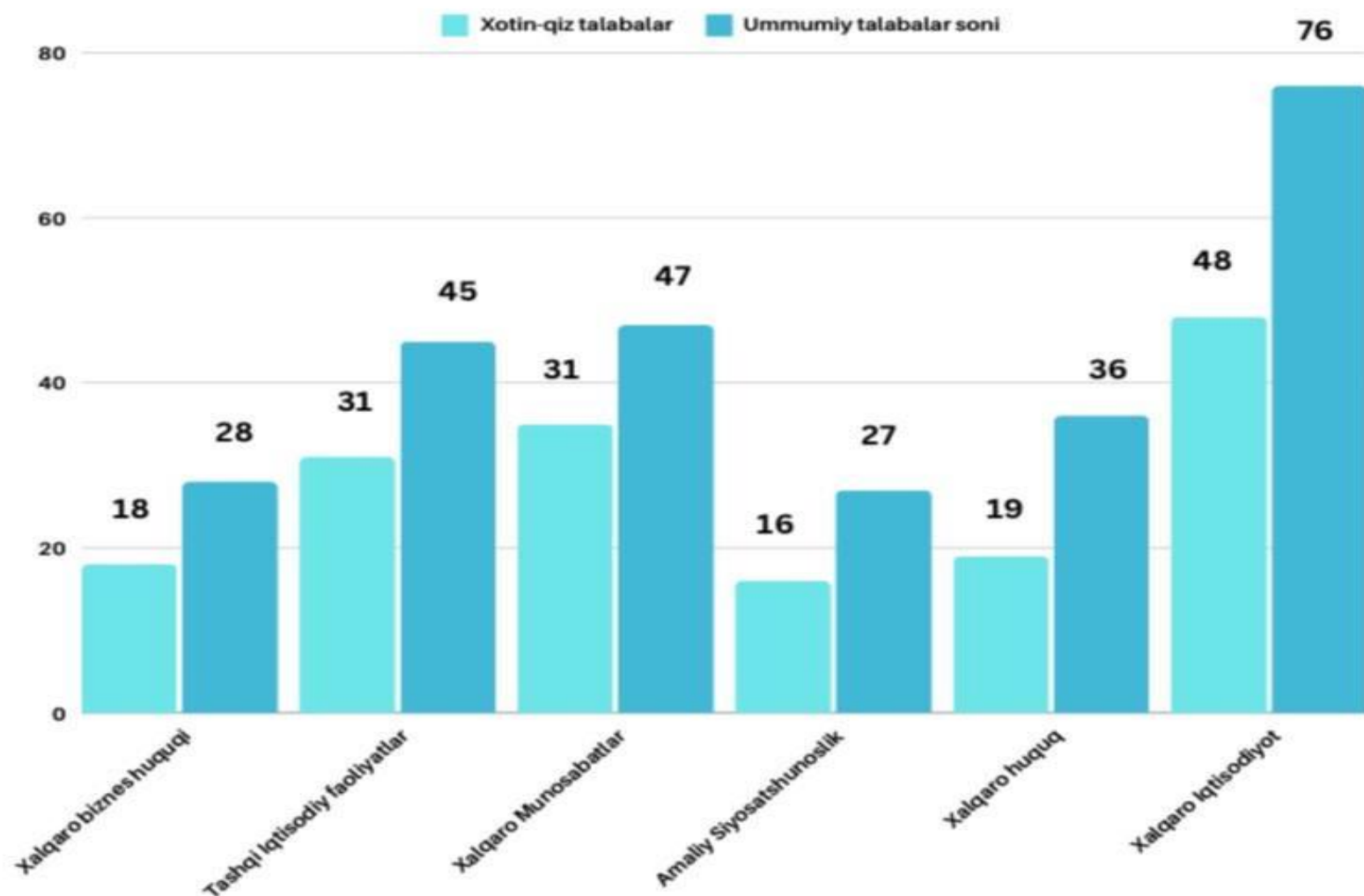






A pivotal policy aimed at fostering gender equality in education has been established for master's degree students. As stipulated in the Decree of the Cabinet of Ministers dated August 15, 2022, tuition fees for women enrolled in master's programs at state universities are fully subsidized by the state budget. This initiative has resulted in the funding of tuition for 109 female students, accounting for 39.2% of the enrollment at the University of World Economy and Diplomacy (UWED) in 2023. This progressive measure significantly enhances access to higher education for women, thereby promoting equitable opportunities in advanced academic pursuits.

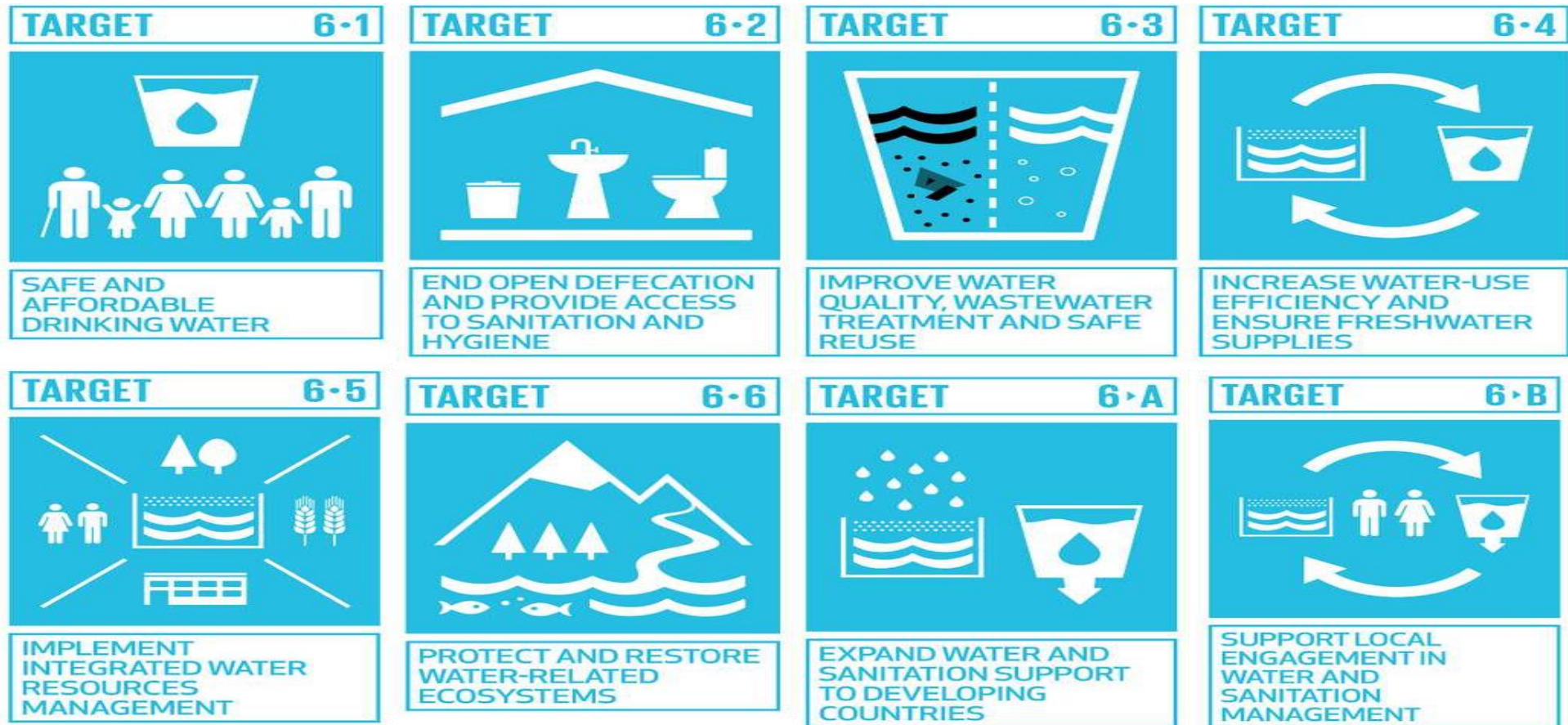

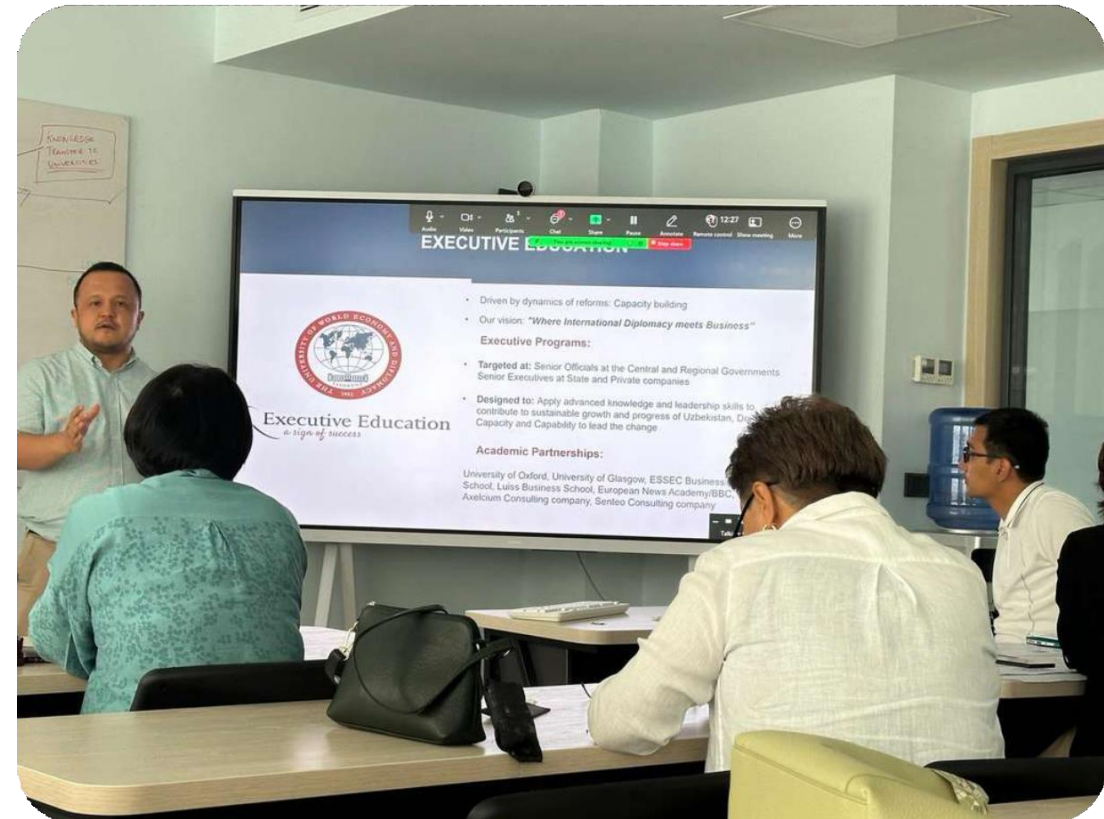

## WATER DIPLOMACY AT UWED: ADVANCING SUSTAINABLE WATER MANAGEMENT FOR SDG 6

From August 5 to 17 of this year, a training on water diplomacy for university professors and young scientists (master's and doctoral students) was held jointly with the National Research University "Tashkent Institute of Irrigation and Agricultural Mechanization", the Diplomatic Academy of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Kyrgyzstan, and the Kazakh-German University within the framework of the Erasmus+ HWCA project "Strengthening Higher Education in the Water Sector to Ensure Climate Resilience and Security in Central Asia". This training was aimed at deepening the knowledge and skills of participants in the field of water diplomacy, exchanging experiences and best practices, as well as developing cooperation between stakeholders to ensure sustainable integrated water resources management in Central Asia. The training was held in a hybrid format with the assistance of leading international, national experts, consultants and practitioners in the field of water management and water diplomacy.







# CURRICULUM IN WATER MANAGEMENT: ADVANCING SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT FOR SDG 6

The university had introduced the course “Contemporary water diplomacy” into curriculum. The course "Contemporary Water Diplomacy" is intrinsically linked to Sustainable Development Goal 6 (SDG 6), which aims to ensure the availability and sustainable management of water and sanitation for all. ## **UWED IS ONE OF THE INITIATORS OF THE HWCA ERASMUS+ TRAINING COURSE ON WATER DIPLOMACY**



The UWED staff is currently working on training course on Water Diplomacy for teaching staff of Central Asian universities commenced, aimed at empowering and educating emerging leaders in sustainable development.

The course is intended to be a joint effort by the University of World Economy and Diplomacy (UWED), Tashkent Institute of Irrigation and Agricultural Mechanization Engineers (TIAME-NRU), Diplomatic Academy of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Kyrgyz Republic (DAMFA-KR), and International Water Management Institute (IWMI) within the framework of the Erasmus+ HWCA project.

This course will be specifically tailored for young professionals and researchers from Central Asia, encompassing a comprehensive curriculum focusing on critical aspects of sustainable development.

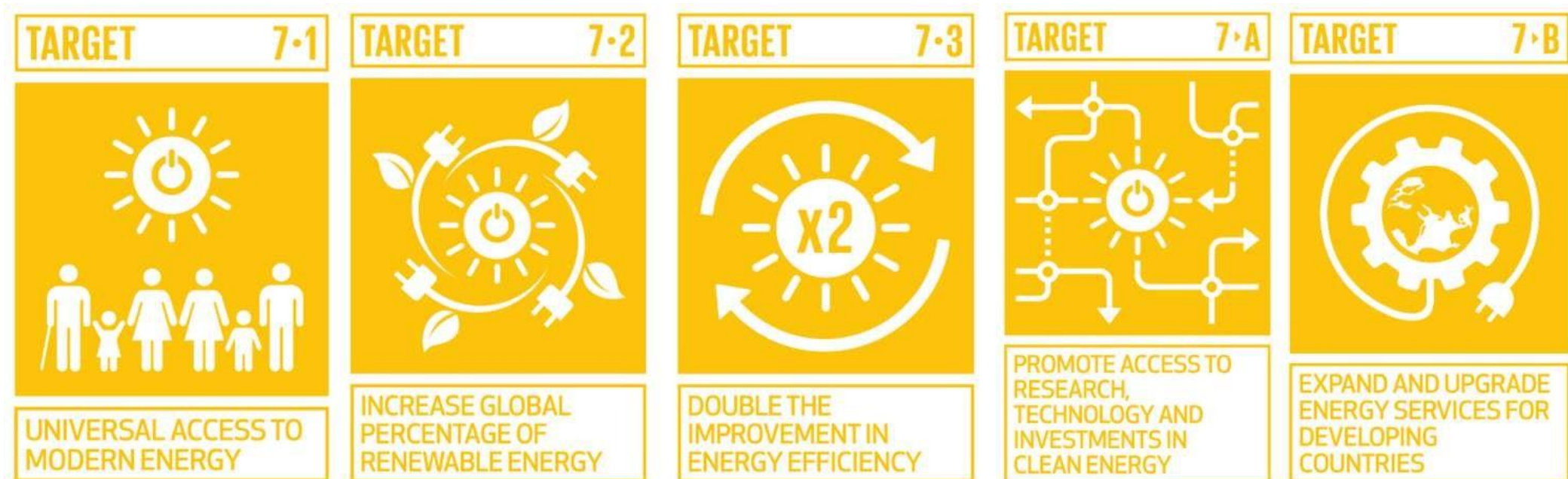

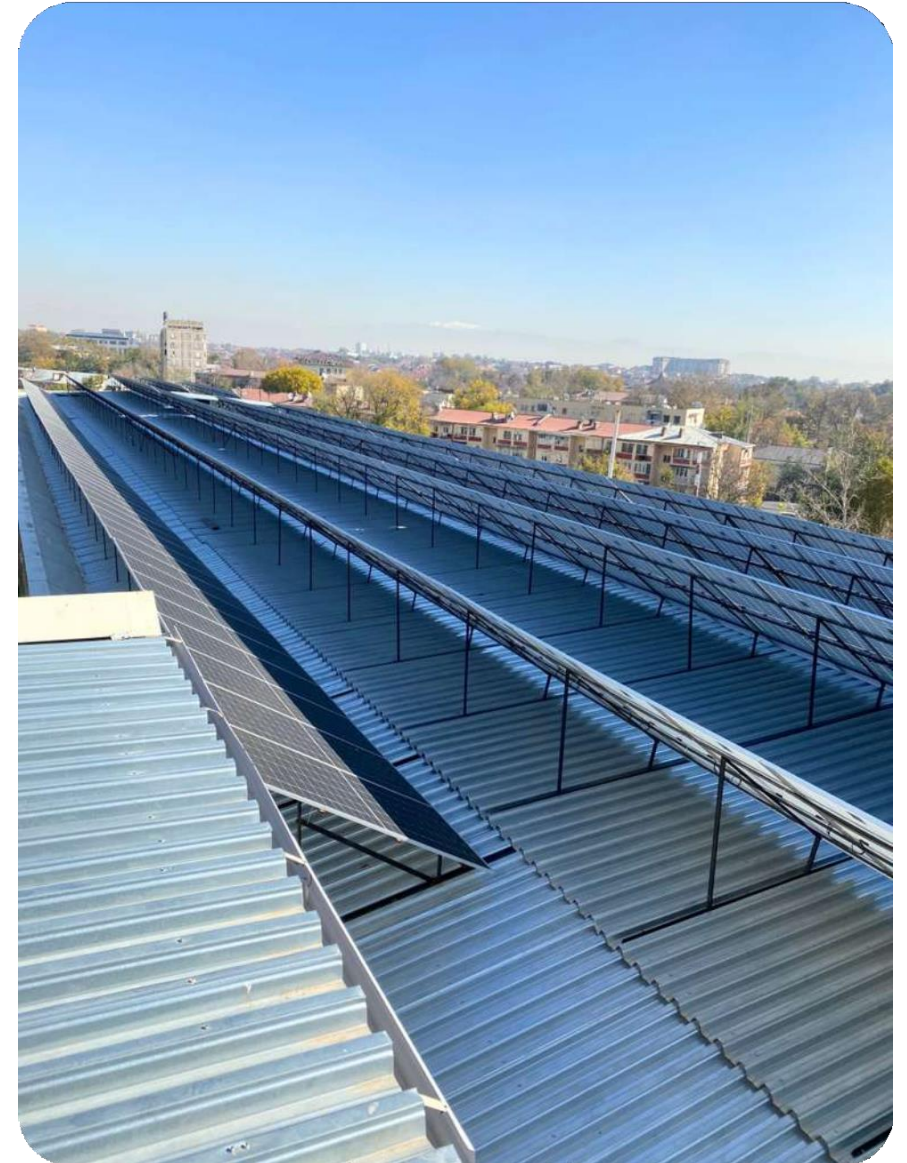

# **EFFICIENCY OF EQUIPPING THE UWED'S BUILDINGS WITH SOLAR PANELS**

The University of World Economy and Diplomacy has started introducing alternative and renewable energy systems, which are considered an integral part of the green economy.

Today, solar panels producing a total of 267 KW of electricity per hour have been installed and put into operation.

According to estimates, the installed solar panels will reduce the university's electricity costs by 20% in the months with less sun, and by 30% in the summer months. The installation of solar panels at UWED began in 2022. This process was continued, and in September 2023, solar panels producing 240 KW of electricity per hour were installed on the roofs of blocks D and G, the student residence and the "SOK" building.

In addition, according to the information provided by the main energy department of the university, this process has not stopped and it is planned to install solar panels producing 50 KW of electricity per hour by the end of the year.

The University of World Economy and Diplomacy (UWED) is actively advancing Sustainable Development Goal 7 (SDG 7) through several renewable energy initiatives. Since 2022, UWED has installed extensive solar panel systems, totaling 507 kW across campus buildings, including the student residence and Eco library, which also promotes environmental awareness. These solar panels reduce the university's electricity costs by 20-30% throughout the year. Additionally, UWED's energy strategy includes continued expansion of solar capacity and various energy efficiency measures, positioning the university as a leader in sustainable energy practices.

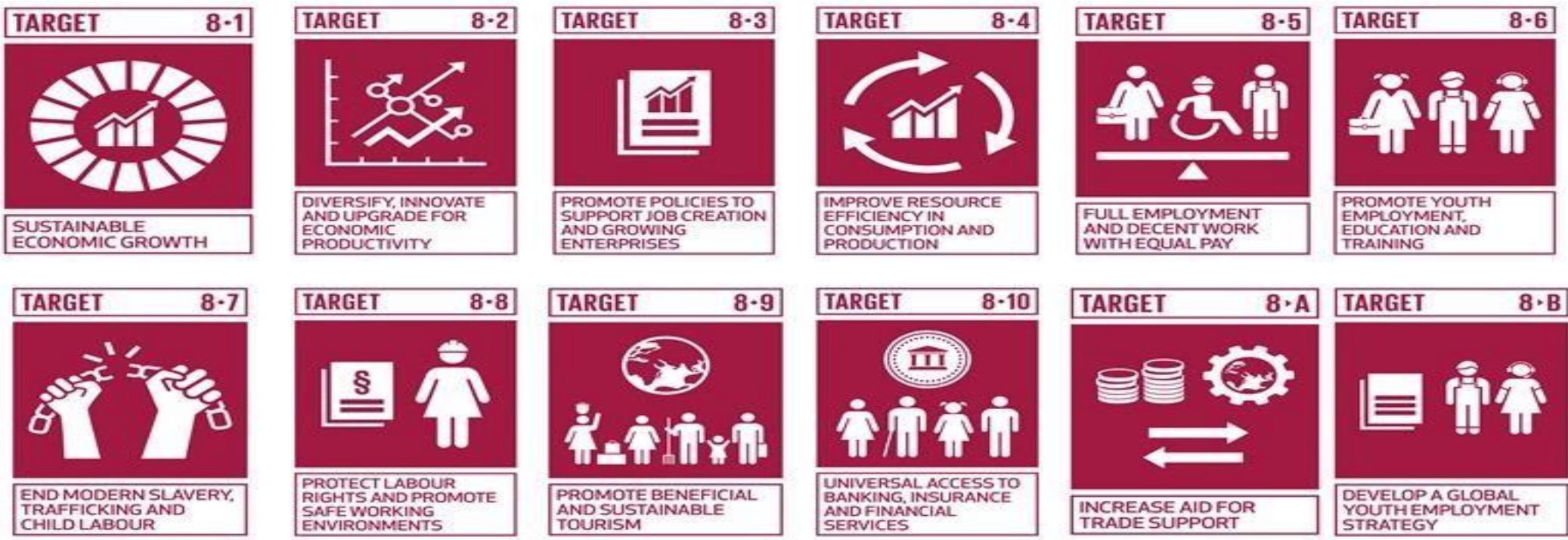

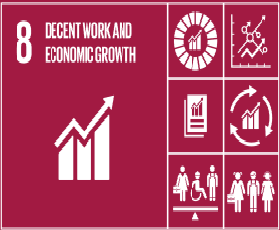

## Центральная Азия в процессе перехода к новому технологическому укладу: оценка ситуации и перспективы

Интервью с Лайло Ташпулатовой, заведующей кафедрой, руководителем Центра «Устойчивое развитие» Института перспективных международных исследований Университета мировой экономики и дипломатии

Ташкент, ноябрь 2023

В современном мире ускоряются процессы внедрения цифровых технологий, известные как Четвертая промышленная революция (ЧПР). Как Вы оцениваете темпы и качество вхождения Центральной Азии в ЧПР на данный момент?

**Л. Ташпулатова:** Четвертая промышленная революция, также известная как Индустрия 4.0, относится к широкому спектру технологических инноваций, включая Интернет вещей (IoT), искусственный интеллект (ИИ), автоматизацию, большие данные (Big Data) и другие цифровые технологии. Эти технологии вносят существенные изменения в производственные процессы, услуги и общество в целом. Общеизвестно, что цифровая трансформация уже сегодня стала драйвером развития мировой экономики, а в течение последующих десяти (ИКТ) будут еще глубже интегрированы в экономику и общество стран мира. По прогнозам международной компании по изучению рынка цифровизации «International Data Corporation», к 2023 г. более 50% всех расходов в сфере ИКТ в мире придется именно на цифровую трансформацию и инновации. При этом исследования показывают, что цифровая экономика растёт в среднем в 2,5 раза быстрее всей экономики в целом, а инвестиции в цифровые технологии опережают «нецифровые» в 6,7 раз. Исследования показывают, что за последние тридцать лет увеличение инвестиций в цифровые технологии на один доллар приводило к увеличению ВВП до 20 долларов, в то время как аналогичное увеличение инвестиций в нетехнологичные отрасли приводило к увеличению ВВП только на 3 доллара.

Страны Центральной Азии уже предпринимают шаги для внедрения цифровых технологий и развития инновационного сектора. В настоящее время все центральноазиатские страны также имеют национальные программы цифровизации. В трех из пяти стран, приняты так называемые цифровые стратегии: «Цифровой Казахстан 2018–2022гг.», «Цифровой Кыргызстан 2019–2023гг.» и «Цифровой Узбекистан – 2030». В то же время, в Таджикистане и Туркменистане программы цифровой трансформации сформулированы в рамках более широких программ национального развития цифровой экономики. Например, принятая «Концепция цифровой экономики в Республике Таджикистан», которая вытекает из «Национальной стратегии развития Республики Таджикистан на период до 2030 года», а также «Концепции развития цифровой экономики Туркменистана на 2019–2025 годы». Данные амбициозные национальные программы и стратегии в основном направлены на развитие цифровой экономики и улучшение ИКТ-инфраструктуры стран ЦА.

## Реформы в Узбекистане стимулируют цифровизацию национальной экономики

Цифровизация превратилась в новый тренд мирового развития и, несмотря на то, что все еще идут споры по определению ее содержания, на практике информационно-коммуникационные технологии уже стали одним из ключевых факторов повышения эффективности экономики и улучшения качества жизни, принятия решений и государственного управления.

Более того, современная мировая экономика переживает стадию цифровой трансформации. Цифровизация расширилась вглубь политических и экономических систем, создав возможности для контроля на основе искусственного интеллекта производственных процессов, дистанционного управления и оказания других видов услуг. В наше время в основе цифровизации лежит освоение технологии 5G. По данным исследовательской компании Strategy Analytics, число пользователей 5G в мире к началу 2023 г. уже превысило 1 млрд.<sup>1</sup> Но развитие не стоит на месте. Уже начался процесс перехода к 5.5G, что будет стимулировать новые потребности, удовлетворить которые может 6G, что даст еще большие возможности для развития.

По данным экспертов, именно цифровизация станет основным двигателем восстановления мировой экономики и дальнейшим источником экономического роста и, по их прогнозу, доля цифровой экономики в глобальном ВВП уже к 2025 г. приблизится к 48,1% против 44,6% в 2020 г.<sup>2</sup>

В этой ситуации Узбекистан, как часть мирового цифрового пространства, стремясь создать развитую открытую экономику и гражданское общество, для дальнейшего прогресса ускоренно интегрируется в вышеуказанный мировой процесс цифровой трансформации, поскольку, по расчетам аналитиков, переход к цифровой экономике позволит увеличить национальный ВВП как минимум на 30%.

В Узбекистане с 2016 г. идут коренные динамичные реформы во всех социально-экономических сферах. Страна вступила в стадию цифровой трансформации экономики. В этих целях, 28 января 2022 г. была принята «Стратегия развития Нового Узбекистана на 2022–2026 гг.», открывающая второй этап модернизации страны. При создании «нового Узбекистана» наряду с другими стратегическими целями, определена цель «развития цифровой экономики в качестве основного «драйвера» с обеспечением увеличения ее объема как минимум в 2,5 раза».

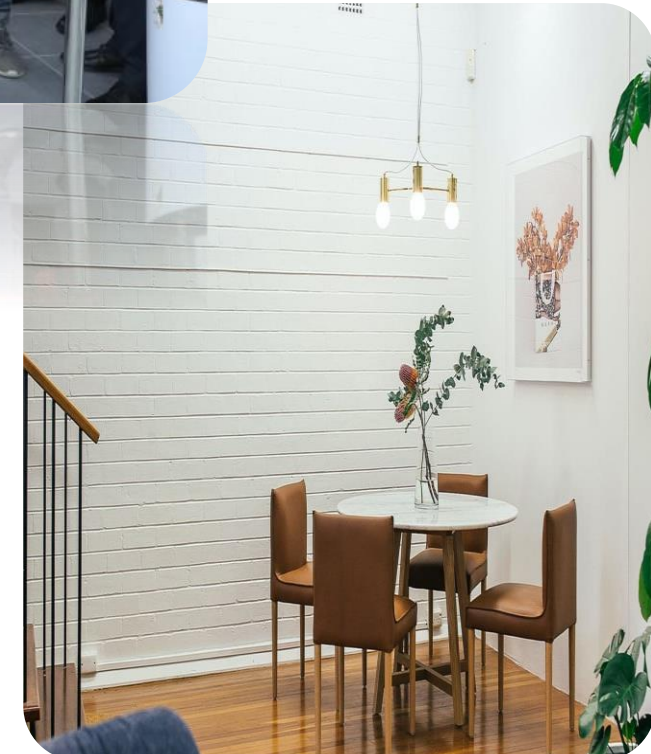






## INCUBATION AND ACCELERATION CENTER *target -9.5*

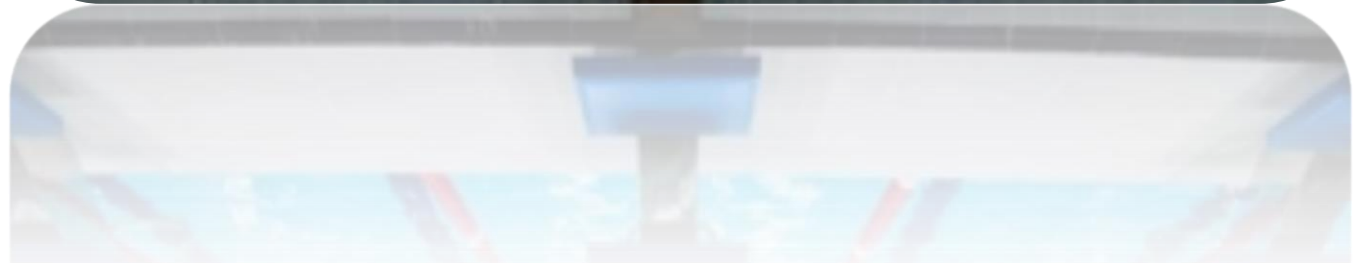

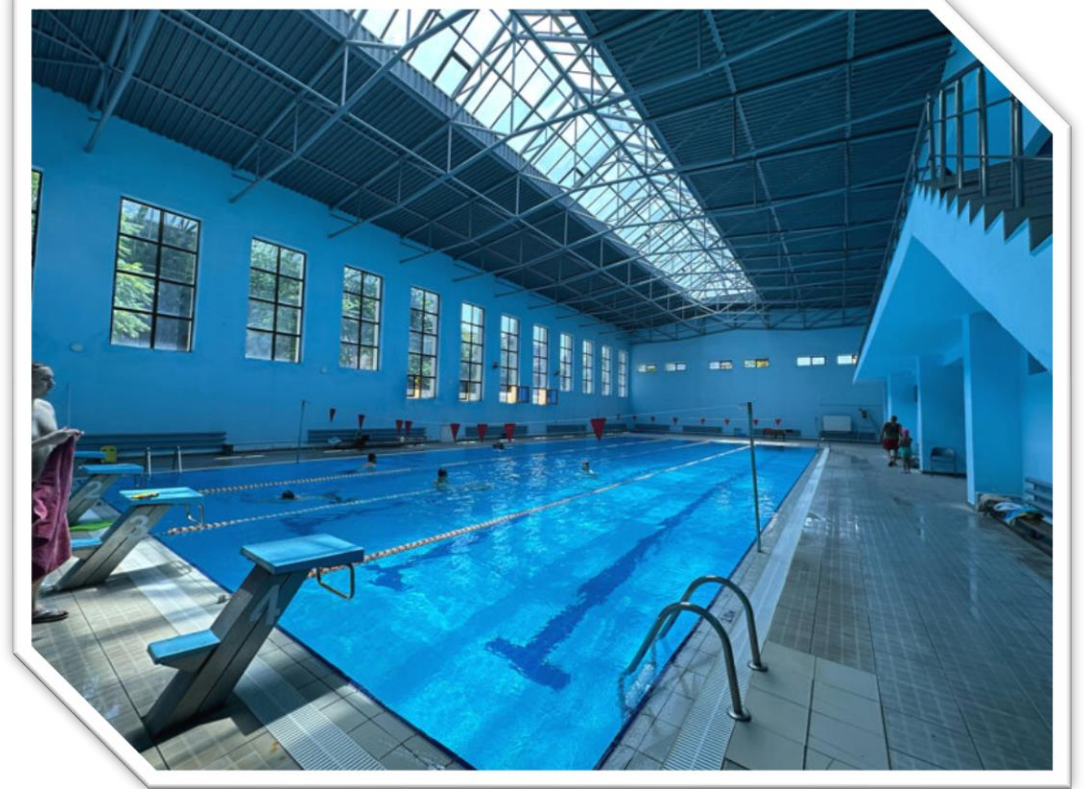

However, despite substantial progress, Uzbekistan, like many countries, still faces significant challenges in combating discrimination due to factors like globalization, migration, and societal polarization, which exacerbate inequalities for vulnerable groups. The alignment with global treaties, such as the Universal Declaration of Human Rights and conventions targeting racial and gender-based discrimination, reinforces Uzbekistan's commitment to equality and its efforts to protect fundamental rights. By adhering to these international standards and prioritizing non-discrimination policies, Uzbekistan is advancing SDG 10 targets to create a more inclusive and just society, tackling both social and economic inequalities.

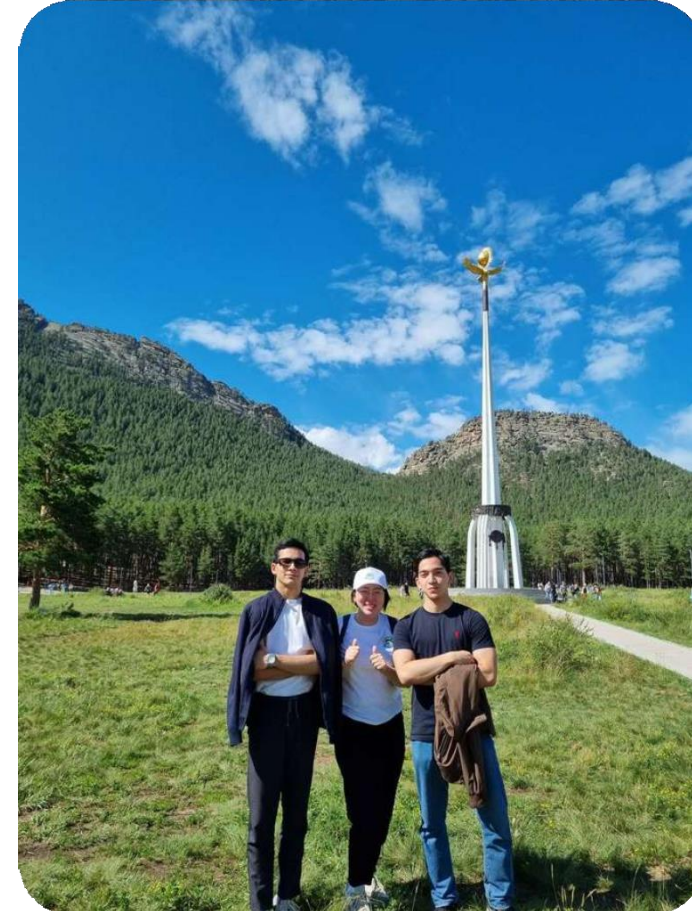


# STRENGTHENING UWED ECOCLUB INITIATIVES AND INTERNATIONAL ENGAGEMENT IN WATER DIPLOMACY

## **THE ROUND TABLE ON “ASSESSMENT THE IMPACT OF CLIMATE CHANGE ON SOCIO-ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT ON A GLOBAL SCALE IN CENTRAL ASIA AND IN UZBEKISTAN TOGETHER WITH THE FRENCH DEVELOPMENT AGENCY (AFD)**

- Climate change is one of the most widespread problems of our time, which poses a threat to the sustainable development of not only individual countries, regions, but also the world as a whole. The acceleration of the dynamics of the negative consequences of climate change is already creating serious risks to food, environmental, energy, social and economic security. That is why, as the impact of climate change intensifies, adaptation to it should become a global priority of international cooperation.
- In order to raise awareness of the measures needed to reduce the risks of climate change among the general public and young people, the University of World Economy and Diplomacy (UWED) together with the French Development Agency (AFD) held a round table devoted to discussing the problems associated with assessing the impact of climate change on socio-economic development on a global scale, in Central Asia and in Uzbekistan on 22 February 2023. The discussions were attended by the First Deputy Chairman of the Senate of the Oliy Majlis of the Republic of Uzbekistan, Rector of UWED Sodik Safoev, the Ambassador of France to Uzbekistan Ms. Aurelia Bouchez, Vincent Copen, Director of the AFD in Central Asia. 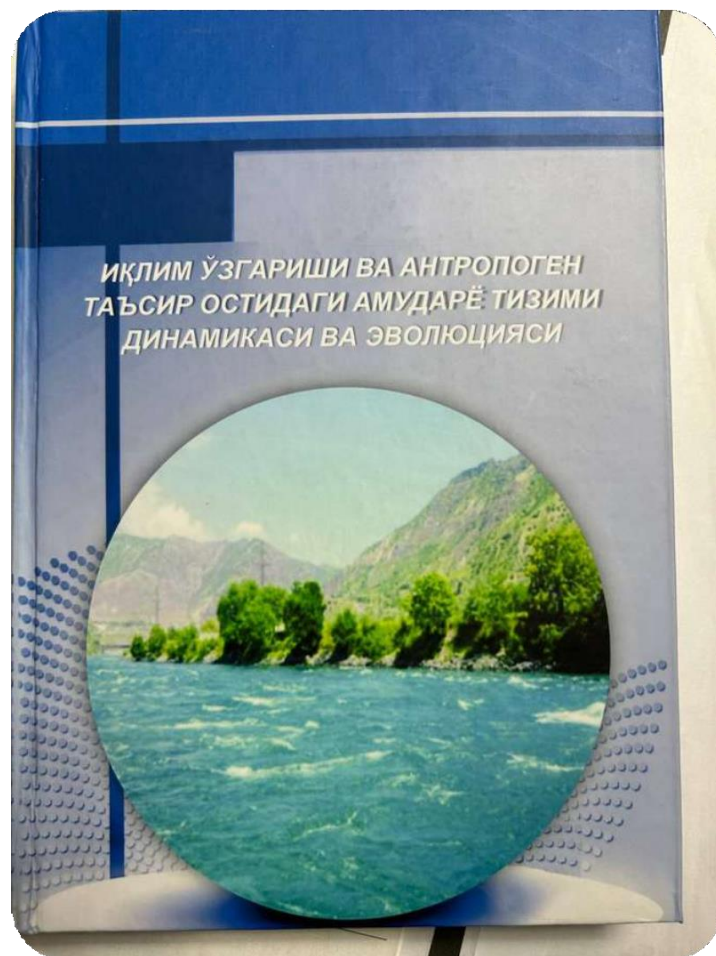

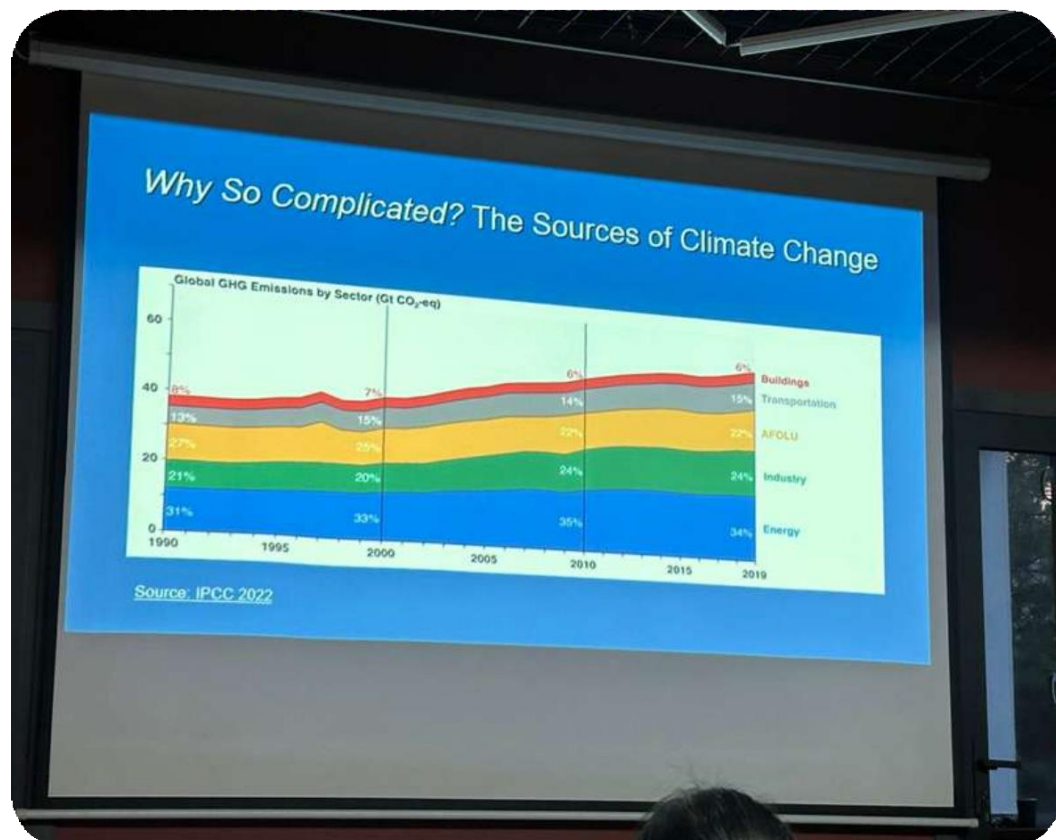

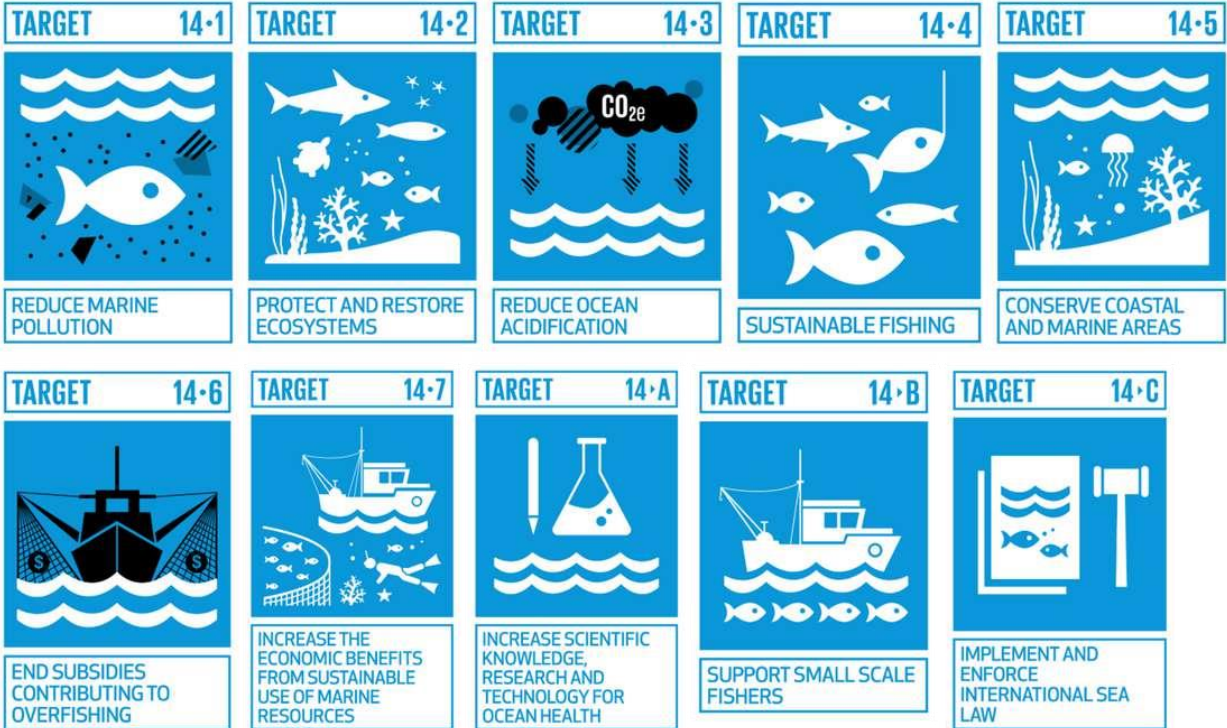

# ARTICLES ON UNDERWATER DEVELOPMENT BY STAFF OF UWED

Abstract. The paper investigates the flow of an incompressible fluid in an open stream with an unequal bottom and slope. The uneven bottom is due to vegetation. The flow is modeled on the basis of the two-velocity Rakhmatulin model, in a laminar regime from zero velocity of the discrete phase. The flow of a viscous fluid in a channel with an open stream with vegetation at the bottom of the stream is considered. The results of numerical simulation of the hydrodynamic features of a two-dimensional viscous flow are presented. The Kozeny-Karman ratio is used as the force of interaction with vegetation. The methods of computational experiment are used to study the effects of non-uniformity of the fluid velocity field, which arise due to vegetation. A qualitative comparison of velocity inhomogeneities is carried out. For the numerical implementation of the resulting equation, which is a generalization of the Navier-Stokes equation, a SIMPLE-like algorithm with appropriate generalizations was used. A single algorithm is applied for the entire area, without highlighting the free and porous zone.





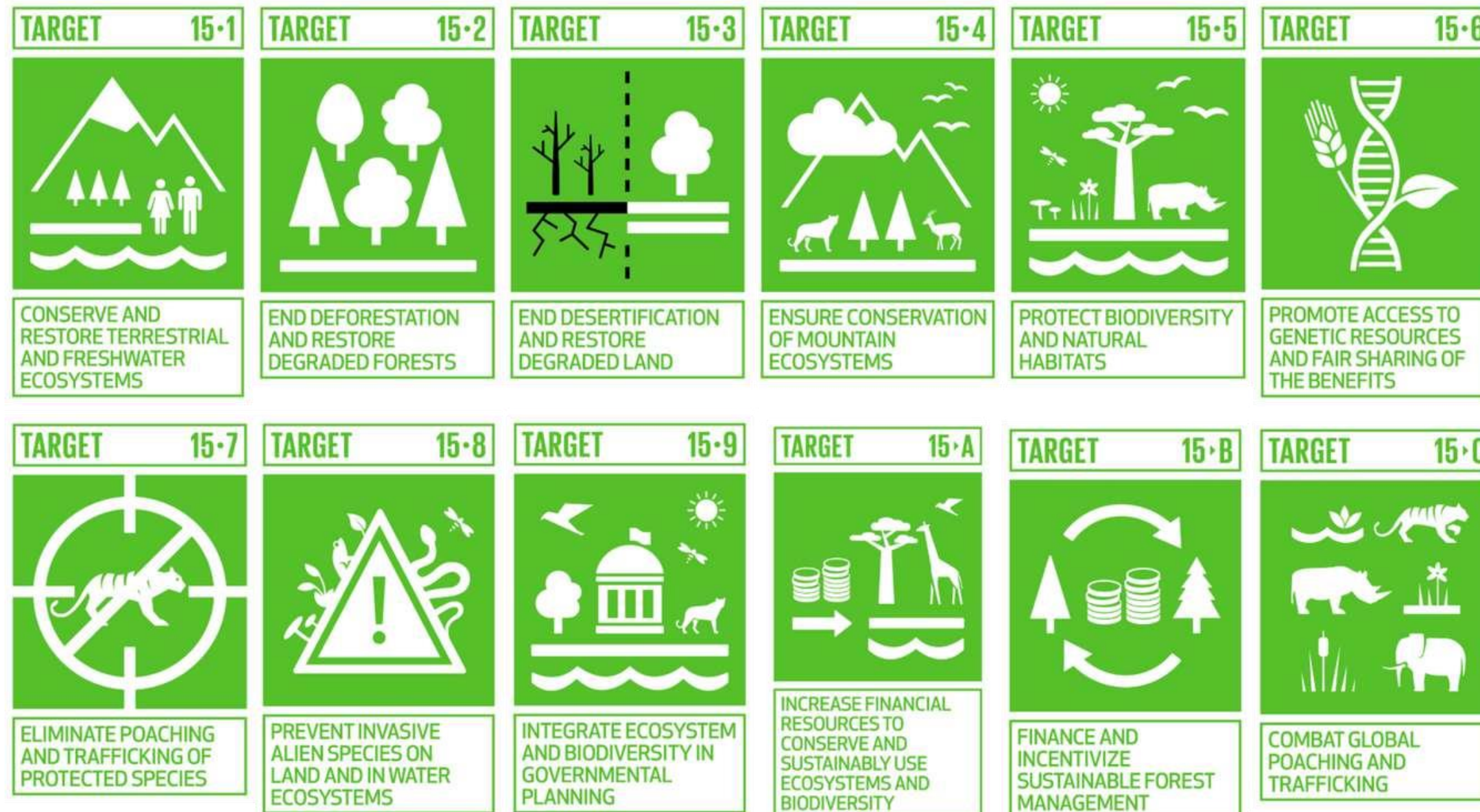

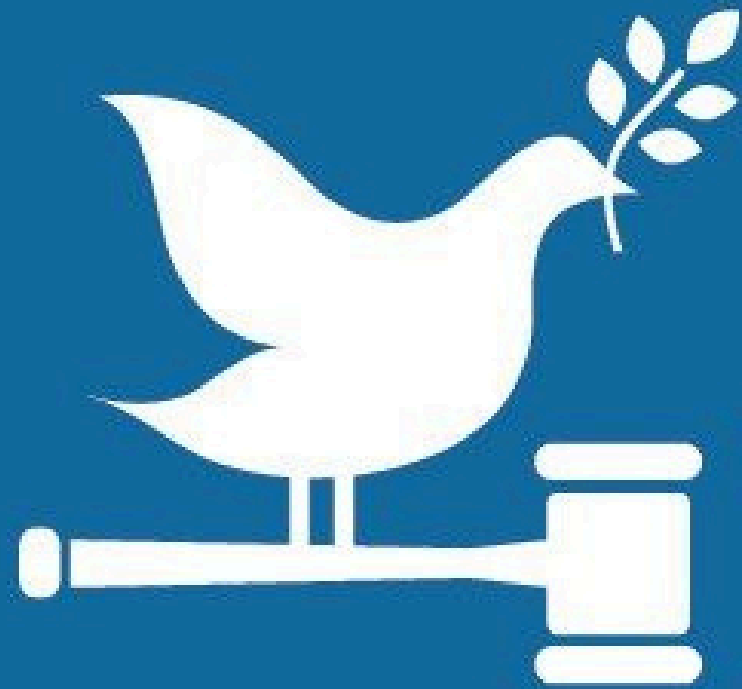

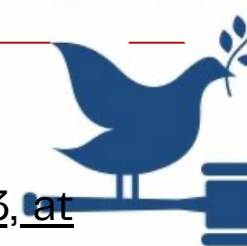


PEACE, JUSTICE AND

# Mobile court



In order to strengthen students' legal literacy, legal knowledge and skills, on November 15, 2023, at the University of World Economy and Diplomacy, the chairman of the Mirzo Ulugbek District Court for Criminal Cases Sh. Bakayev, judges M. Kayumov, S. Abdug'aniyev, a mobile court session was organized with the participation of M. Kukiyeu.

At the meeting, the Decree of the President of the Republic of Uzbekistan No. PF-158 of September 11, 2023 on the strategy "Uzbekistan - 2030", as well as amendments and additions to the Criminal Procedure Code of the Republic of Uzbekistan Students of the Faculty of International Law were closely introduced to the content and essence of supplements, the practice of applying international norms to procedural legislation. In addition to legal skills, mobile court cases help students improve their analytical skills. The objectives of the mobile court session were successfully achieved.

At the meeting, students received answers to their questions about prevention of crime among young people, in particular, theft, violation of traffic rules and cyber crimes and measures to protect against them.



On February 22, 2023, a mobile court session was held at JIDU under the chairmanship of Mirzo Ulugbek district court judges S. Abduganiyev and M. Kukiyeu.

Vice-rector of the university O. Yusufjanov, deputy dean of the Faculty of International Relations S. Ibadullayev and students of the second stage of the Faculty of International Law took part in the court process.





# Monitoring of closed institutions for minors in order to ensure their access to Justice

On August 16–17, 2023, the Representative of the Oliy Majlis of the Republic of Uzbekistan on Children's Rights (Ombudsman) and the Legal Clinic of the University of World Economy and Diplomacy, on the basis of the Memorandum on joint activities and "Monitoring closed institutions in order to ensure access to justice for minors" within the framework of the project, he carried out monitoring of the investigative detention center of the Ministry of Internal Affairs in Zangiota district.

The project "Monitoring closed institutions for minors in order to ensure their access to justice" is aimed at protecting children's rights and ensuring equal opportunities for them in the judicial process. The monitoring results are used in seminars at the Legal Clinic and in the further development of recommendations and proposals for the effective implementation of international standards into national legislation.

At the end of the trial, Rakhimov A.Sh., who conducted the trial as a judge, interpreted the speeches of both parties and gave them practical advice and valuable guidance on the protection of intellectual property rights. He also emphasized the prospects and relevance of this area of law.

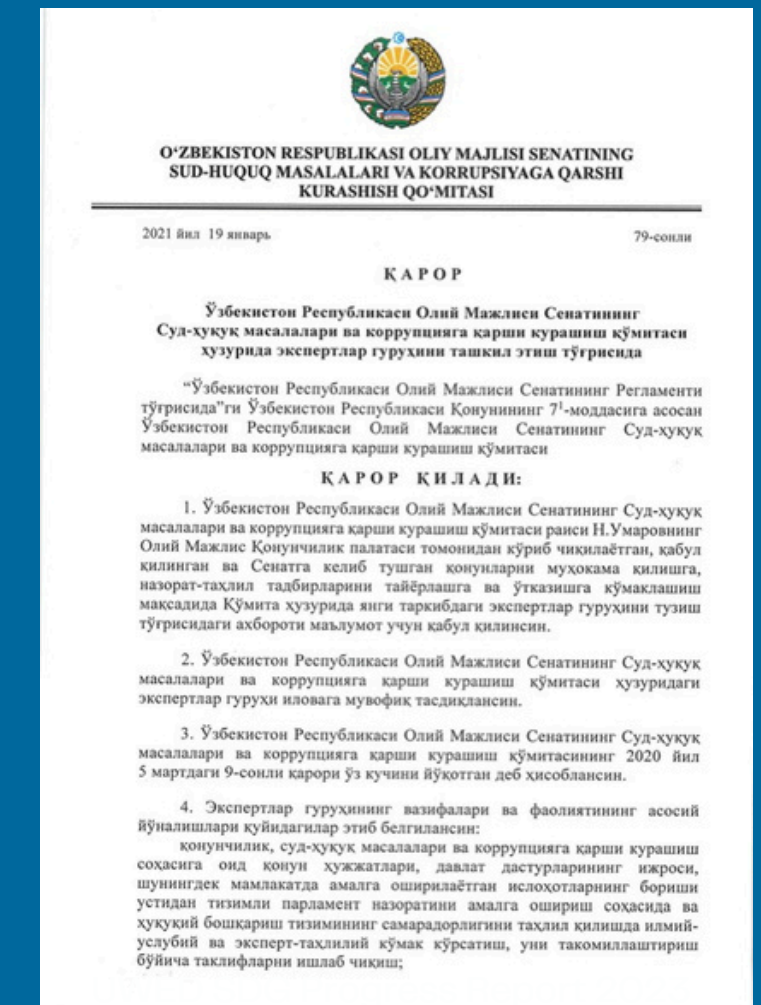


## Fighting Against Corruption

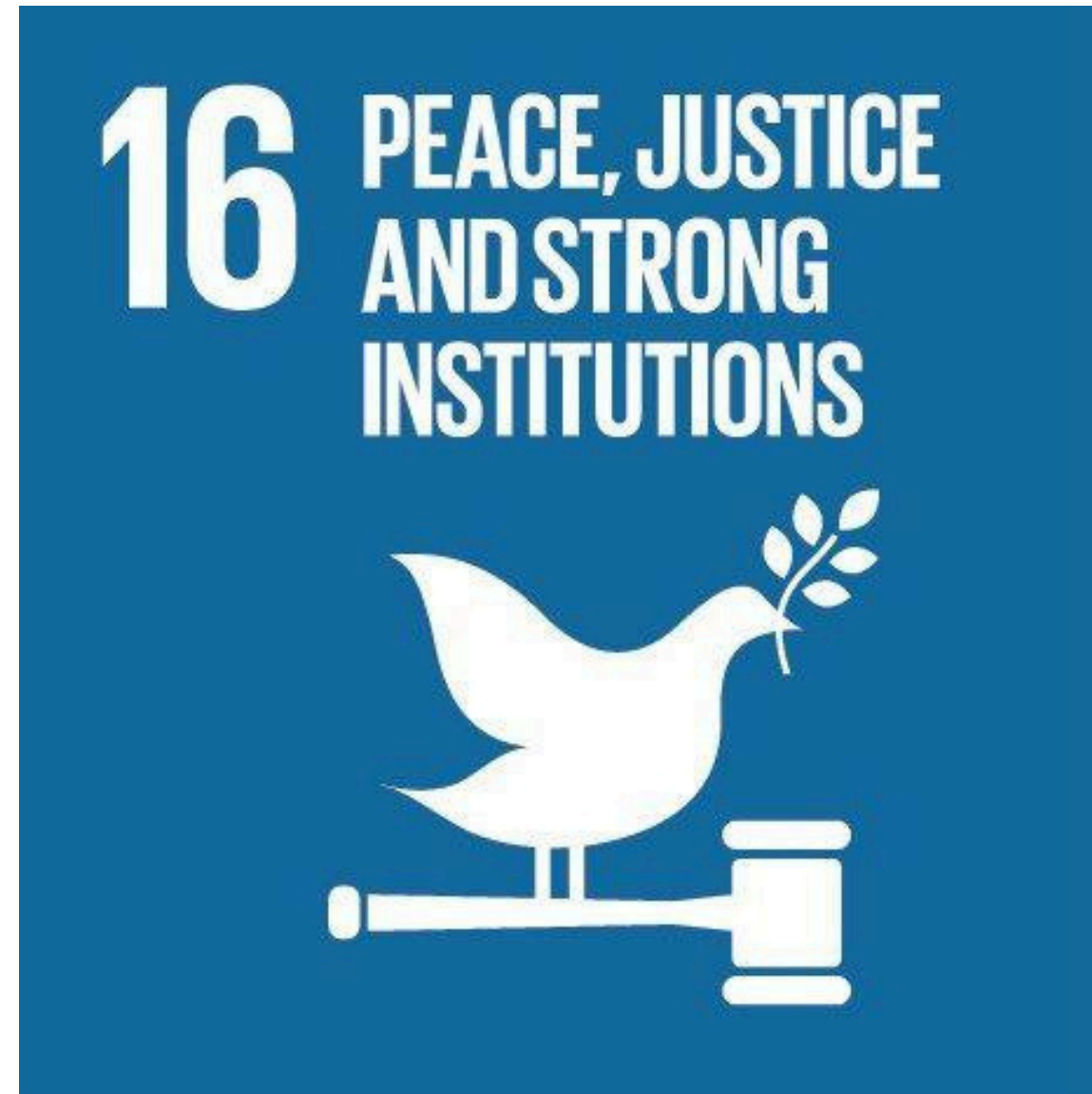

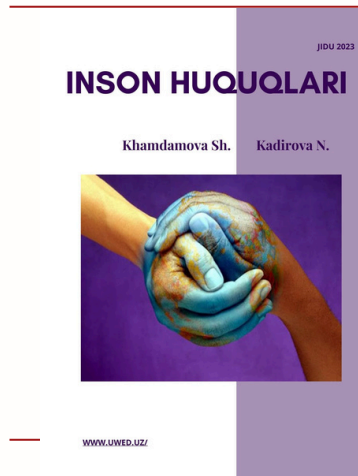

- The UWED MUN 2023 conference is a platform for the active exchange of ideas, the creation of new diplomatic ties and the formation of positive contributions to the development of the international community.



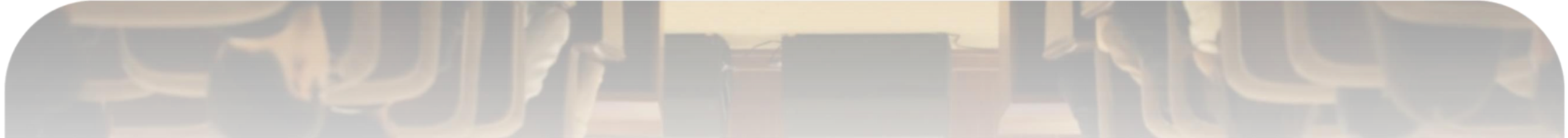


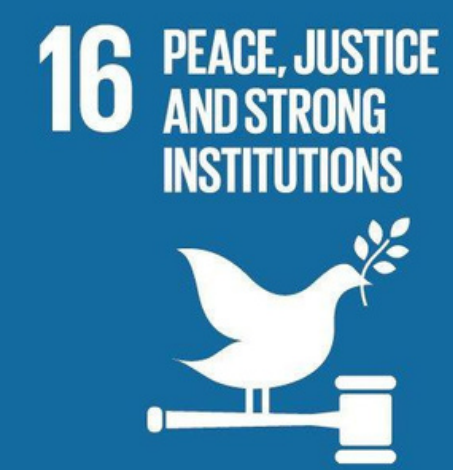



Md Zahanger Alam, specializing in World Economy (08.00.09), has defended his PhD dissertation in Economic Sciences on the topic "Factors Affecting the Adoption of Technology-Driven International Trade: Asia Context."

Md Zahanger Alam's research on "Factors affecting the adoption of technology-driven international trade: Asia context" highlights the significance of technology-driven trade in enhancing regional partnerships. This aligns with SDG 17's focus on fostering collaboration between countries to improve trade connections and technological exchange, which ultimately drives economic growth and sustainable development in the region. The adoption of technology in international trade allows Asian countries, including Uzbekistan and Bangladesh, to enhance their global competitiveness. This connection to SDG 17.6 underscores the importance of partnerships in enabling access to modern technologies and knowledge-sharing, supporting nations in achieving both economic and social goals.

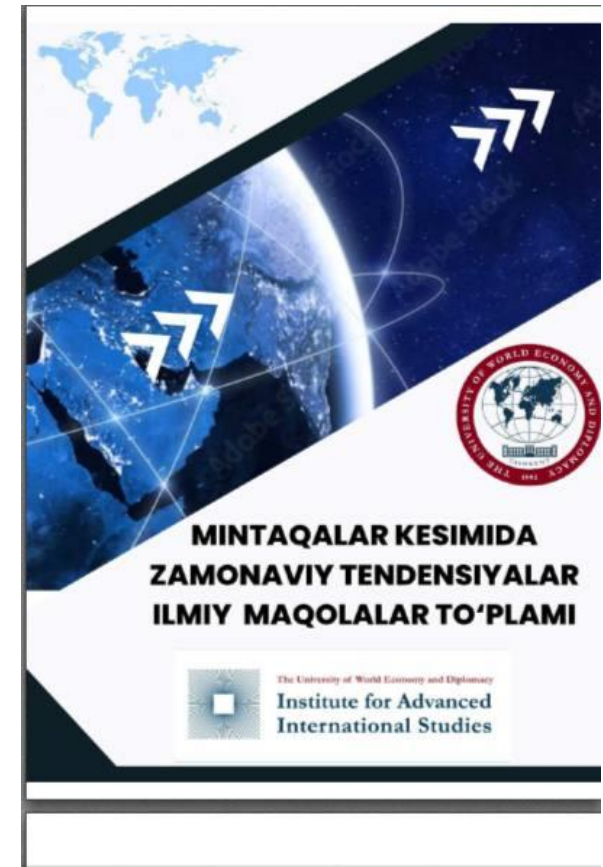

## MEETINGS

UWED has become *a cooperation platform* that provides friendly, purposeful and open dialogue between Uzbekistan and foreign countries and organizations. In particular, the university took an active part in the organization of the next meeting of the inter-parliamentary commission on cooperation between the Oliy Majlis of the Republic of Uzbekistan and the Kyrgyz Republic Jokorg Kenesi . 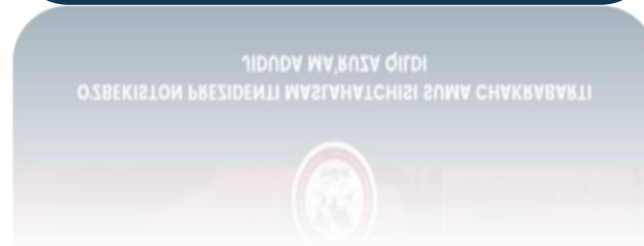




## EDUCATION TOWARDS SDG

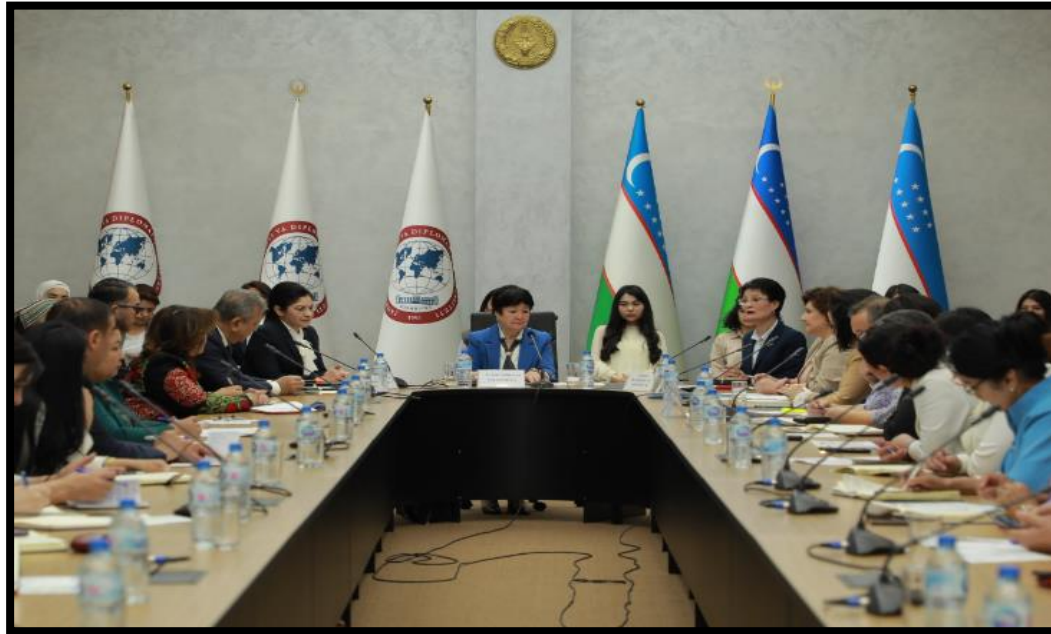

- Systematic work is carried out to develop the most effective mechanisms and implement practices in order to achieve SDG at UWED. The conference was organized on the topic "*Women's external migration: the problem and its solution*" , "Development of the normative legal basis of diplomatic activity and diplomatic service in the Republic of Uzbekistan" , conferences on "*History and archeology: increasing the value of cultural heritage and territories*" , " An example of this is the international roundtable on the topic "*Regional development in Central Asia: approaches and priorities*" . At these events, representatives of state and non-state organizations, universities, and other institutions of civil society thoroughly studied the problems and made proposals for their solution.

- The university also conducts systematic work on capacity building of government officials, heads of NGOs and representatives of other public organizations. Training courses for employees of the Cabinet of Ministers of the Republic of Uzbekistan, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, the Ministry of Defense, *the Ministry of Investments, Industry and Trade, agencies under the Presidential Administration of Uzbekistan* have been opened at the *Diplomatic Academy under UWED*. Lifelong learning programs - "Modern Industrial Policy", "Public-Private Partnership", "Strategy and Transformation Management", *Development of Leadership and Corporate Culture* etc. - serves as an open space not only for Uzbek, but also for foreign listeners.

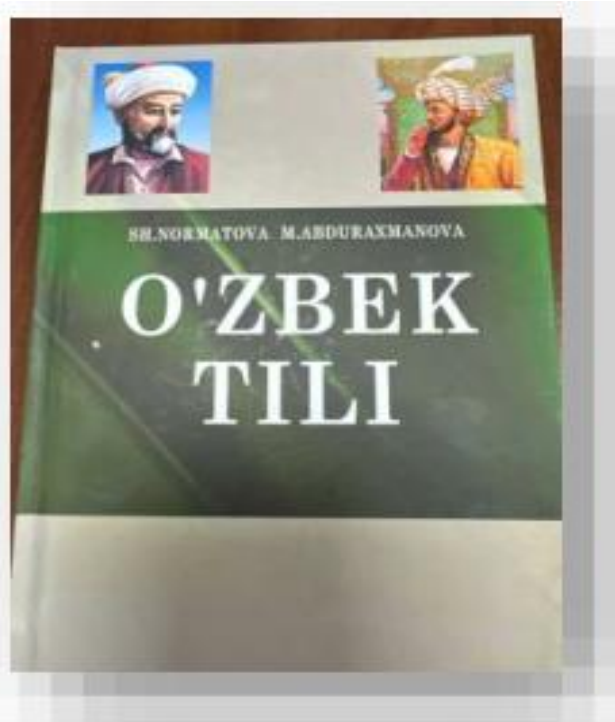
